## IRS Announces 2012 Standard Mileage Rates

The Internal Revenue Service has issued the 2012 optional standard mileage rates used to calculate the deductible costs of operating an automobile for business, charitable, medical or moving purposes.

Beginning on Jan. 1, 2012, the standard mileage rates for the use of a car (also vans, pickups or panel trucks) will be:

- 55.5 cents per mile for business miles driven
- 23 cents per mile driven for medical or moving purposes
- 14 cents per mile driven in service of charitable organizations

The rate for business miles driven is unchanged from the mid-year adjustment that became effective on July 1, 2011. The medical and moving rate has been reduced by 0.5 cents per mile.

The standard mileage rate for business is based on an annual study of the fixed and variable costs of operating an automobile. The rate for medical

and moving purposes is based on the variable costs as determined by the same study. Independent contractor Runzheimer International conducted the study.

Taxpayers always have the option of calculating the actual costs of using their vehicle rather than using the standard mileage rates.

A taxpayer may not use the business standard mileage rate for a vehicle after using any depreciation method under the Modified Accelerated Cost Recovery System (MACRS) or after claiming a Section 179 deduction for that vehicle. In addition, the business standard mileage rate cannot be used for more than four vehicles used simultaneously.

These and other requirements for a taxpayer to use a standard mileage rate to calculate the amount of a deductible business, moving, medical or charitable expense are in Rev. Proc. 2010-51.

### NLRB Postpones Effective Date for Employee Rights Notice—Again!

The National Labor Relations Board has agreed to postpone the effective date of its employee rights notice-posting rule at the request of the federal court in Washington, DC, hearing a legal challenge regarding the rule. The Board’s ruling states that it has determined that postponing the effective date of the rule would facilitate the resolution of the legal challenges that have been filed with respect to the rule. The new implementation date is April 30, 2012.

Most private sector employers will be required to post the 11-by-17-inch notice on the new implementation date of April 30. Additional information about the notice is available from the NLRB website: <http://www.nlr.gov/poster>. AAIMEA will keep members updated on new developments.

## See Art Made Live at "Art 4 Art's Sake"

The Next Picture Show is organizing the 5th Annual Art for Art's Sake fundraiser on Saturday, March 10, 2012, at Sauk Valley Community College, 173 IL Rt 2. This is one of our major fundraisers for the year.

The Next Picture Show is a not-for-profit art gallery serving Dixon and surrounding communities in the arts and beyond. In addition to providing a large gallery space for the exhibitions of area artists and an annual outdoor art event (Nuts About Art), the gallery holds several unique events throughout the year that provide a level of interesting insight into the creative process. The gallery also hosts the Illinois Watercolor Association's annual show which attracts artists from all 52 states.

The Next Picture Show touches the community providing the space and the events that nurture, develop, educate, foster and galvanize artists and patrons of the arts. TNPS is a place where the arts are created, shown, studied and celebrated.

### U S Postal Service to Adjust Prices effective January 22, 2012

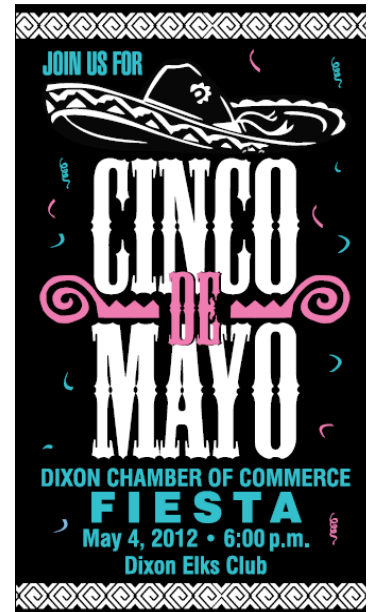
Prices for most Postal Service mailing services will change on January 22, 2012. Mailing services include First-Class Mail, Standard Mail, Periodicals, Package Services and Extra Services. Prices for shipping services will also change on January 22.

While actual percentage price increases for various products and services varies, the overall average price increase across all mailing services is capped by law at 2.1 percent, the rate of inflation as measured by the consumer Price Index.

#### FIRST-CLASS MAIL HIGHLIGHTS:

- Letters (1 oz.) – 1-cent increase to 45 cents. This is the first increase in the price of a First-Class Mail stamp since May 2009.
- Single-piece letters additional ounce rate – unchanged at 20 cents.
- Postcards – 3-cent increase to 32 cents
- Letters to Canada or Mexico (1 oz.) – 5-cent increase to 85 cents
- Letters to other international destinations – 7-cent increase to \$1.05
- The second ounce will be free for First-Class Mail Presort pieces weighing between one and two ounces.

### Illinois Chamber Holiday Survey Results for 2012

Each year, the Illinois Chamber of Commerce conducts a survey that indicates how Illinois employers and their employees will be handling paid holidays. The Illinois Chamber has compiled the results from its annual paid Holiday Survey for 2012.

Many Illinois businesses use the Chamber's Annual Holiday Survey as a useful tool in helping them to determine holiday benefits for employees. The survey has long been regarded as the standard to follow. With nearly 700 responses from a cross-section of Illinois businesses, the results provide a good indicator of what employers have planned for 2012.

Holidays included in this survey are Martin Luther King Jr. Day, Lincoln's Birthday, Presidents' Day, Washington's Birthday, Casimir Pulaski's Birthday, Good Friday, Memorial Day, Independence Day, Labor Day, Columbus Day, Election Day, Jewish Holidays, Veterans Day, Thanksgiving, Christmas, New Year's Day, and Employee's Birthday.

Compiled from hundreds of responses from Illinois businesses of all size and industries, the survey indicated that the average number of paid holidays for Illinois workers is 8.2 days, slightly lower than in 2011. The average number of paid personal days is 2.8 days.

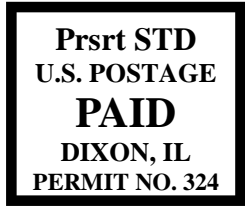
